

A Walkway for Waban Sanford-Springvale Rotary Club helps connect hiking trails for all

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SANFORD — Members of the Sanford-Springvale Rotary Club built a 110-foot boardwalk on Saturday, Sept. 28, that will connect two section of Waban's handicapped-accessible hiking trails on its property along Bauneg Beg Lake.



The trails are used by people of all abilities as part of Waban's four-season TREE program. TREE stands for Teambuilding, Leadership, and Environmental Education.

During the winter months, many groups, public schools and individuals use the trails for snowshoeing, wildlife habitat studies and good ol' general fun.

To fund the project, The Rotary Foundation donated \$2,000, which was awarded through a Rotary District Grant, and the club matched that with \$2,000.
